BLOWDOWN LOWDOWN

Thanks to the early appearance of Spring-like weather recently, our Chapter has already started working on clearing trails. We have had 2 work parties on the Lower Big Quilcene Trail in the last 2 weeks, clearing blowdowns. Our Chapter's 3 Forest Service-certified chainsaw operators were hard at work in response to reports of impassable sections of this lower elevation trail. (see pictures, pg. 2). There is still some work to be done, and one of the bridges across the river was severely damaged and will have to be replaced, but I am excited that so much work has been done already so early in the year. We are hoping to be able to offer more support this year to the various agencies we work with, especially in the face of the severe budget shortfalls and cutbacks expected. After getting by for years on very little for trails maintenance, public land managers are facing even bigger challenges now and for the foreseeable future to get the help they need to keep trails open. This is where organizations like ours can help make a difference. If we want to continue to be able to use trails on public lands, we are going to have to pitch and do what we can to fill in the gaps, whether by getting involved in work parties, making donations, working to secure grant monies, making phone calls and sending e-mails to legislators and county commissioners, or just by attending meetings and being informed. This month's Chapter meeting is being set aside as an opportunity for all our members to come together and brainstorm on ideas to take our "little chapter that could" into the future. Any comments, questions, concerns or ideas you have about any aspect of our organization are what we are looking for this Thursday night at Chimacum Saddlery and Tack, 7 pm. It could be ideas for fun activities, projects you would like to see us undertake, suggestions for programs at Chapter meetings, or information you want to share; all input and feedback is welcome at this session, but we need you to be there!

As volunteers we are looking for ways to be a positive force in our communities . Your membership is a testament to your commitment to keeping trails and public lands open and rideable for everyone. Thank you!




Trail Work, Lower Big Quil Trail, 2/5/2010
