At Liberty

At our August meeting members of the Buckhorn Range Chapter were treated to an entertaining show complete with music! Bethel Moore of Chimacum Saddlery together with her equine partner Joe worked "at liberty" together. Joe was not wearing any tack whatsoever (neither was Bethel for that matter). It was just Joe and Bethel in the middle of the huge new and wonderful arena. I kept waiting for Joe to take off to run and buck but instead he listened attentively to what Bethel was telling him to do. The first part of the performance Joe and Bethel were standing at quite a distance from each other. As soon as Bethel signaled to Joe to come he did just that and walked on over to where Bethel was standing. After that Bethel somehow signaled to Joe that he was to trot around her and he did then halted and at Bethel's next cue he pivoted on his haunches in both directions. The audience was listening to music the whole time this show was going on. We heard the beautiful refrains from "Man from Snowy River", "The End Title" and The Chase. The music became more dramatic as Joe and Bethel picked up the pace. He side passed at the trot to the left and then to the right. Perhaps the most impressive move was the way Bethel managed to have Joe begin a slow jog and then gradually expanded the jog into an extended trot and then came back to a jog. This is a common place dressage exercise but remember this was being done from the ground with no halter, no lunge line and no lead rope! The communication between Joe and Bethel that we witnessed seemed holy. He never took his attention away from her and it was clear he only wanted to please.

When asked, Bethel said it took her all of last winter working with Joe on Sundays to bring him this far in his liberty work. Then this last Spring she followed Clinton Anderson videos. Her one training aid, aside from her voice and hands, was a "carrot stick." A "carrot stick" is like an inflexible longeing whip but used in a very different way. Bethel sells 'carrot sticks' at the store and she rents the Clinton Anderson videos. Watching Joe and Bethel work together motivated me to work with my horse from the ground. Bethel assured me that it is really fun to have your horse so in tune with you. She said that her riding improved because she and her horse can communicate so much better. She believes that this kind of ground work builds respect and confidence between horse and rider. At the end of the performance when Joe took a bow to our applause Bethel's smile lighted her whole face.





October 8, 2009

Meeting called to order at 7:20

Present: Dave Peterson, Bob Hoyle, Harold Elyea, Gerry Magunuson, Jon Schleiger, Judith Hoyle and Juelie Dalzell Juelie Dalzell gave the Director's Report since Jeff was on assignment in Alaska. As a result of listening to the director's report Harold voiced concern over the liability issue for public land owners. He told us that in California that was one of the main reasons for stock was excluded from both public and private lands. Harold is willing to work on this legislative issue. Jeff should give his name and email to the public land's committee if helpful. Otherwise Juelie will put him on leg. Committee for visit to Olympia if this issue needs public comment.

Trail Boss Report: Bob suggested we ride Gibbs Lake for our October 17th Chapter ride and it was agreed to by all present. Riders should wear bright colors since hunting season opened. Bob will send an email to notify chapter members of the ride.

The ever popular Donut Ride along Chimacum Ridge occurs on November 21st. Dave Peterson will organize a work party to clear the trail from Gerry's to Dave's. The work party for clearing the ridge trail is tentatively scheduled for November 1st.

It was moved, seconded and approved to present Bruce and Bethel Moore with a family membership to BRC for providing our Chapter with a meeting location.
